ACADEMIC YEAR 2022-23

The College Film Club was started with a view to conduct film related awareness among its members and conducts seminars, workshops, film review contests, documentary film screening etc. The activity of the Film Club is to draw students towards an active involvement in the Film Club through continued activities and video shoot competitions. The events were intended not only to expandtheir knowledge in the field of cinematography and associated science, but also to impart a cultural value as well as an obligation towards the society they live in.

The Kottakkal Farook Arts and Science College Film Club demonstrated its commitment to cinematic education and appreciation through two significant events during the academic year 2022-23. These events, carefully curated to provide diverse cinematic experiences, showcased the club's dedication to fostering a rich film culture on campus while enhancing students' critical thinking and analytical skills in relation to cinema.

The academic year began with the "Alfred Hitchcock Thriller Night" on Nov 25, 2022, an immersive marathon screening of classic thrillers that attracted 60 participants. Both events were led by distinguished individuals - the Hitchcock night was inaugurated by Unni Krishnan K, Assistant Professor from Government College Tanur, while the short film screenings were guided by Shamzu Zayba, an alumnus of the college who has become a Malayalam film director. These events not only

provided entertainment but also served as platforms for in-depth discussions, analysis, and appreciation of various aspects of filmmaking, from classic techniques to contemporary short-

form storytelling.

Educational Objectives:


The Weekend Short Film Screenings aimed to achieve several learning outcomes:
