This IQAC led quality enhancement process includes feedback collection on various important aspects of the curriculum such as the need-based importance of the curriculum, clarity of the course objectives, effectiveness of course contents and activities, the learning assessments, availability of referential materials, etc.

For the academic year 2020-2021, a total of 337 students provided their feedback.

4. Resource Provision:


- Ensure the availability of prescribed books and reading materials in the library.
- Provide all necessary provisions for the successful completion of courses.


5. Innovative Teaching Methods:

- Actively encourage internships, field visits, and other out-of-classroom learning activities.


6. Evaluation and Feedback:

- Ensure timely completion of the syllabus and fair evaluation practices.







The majority (34.72%) of students strongly agree that Periodical assessments and feedback are conducted. An additional 38.58% agree, indicating general satisfaction. However, 10.68% express disagreement, and 0% strongly disagree, suggesting potential areas for improvement. A smaller percentage (16.02%) remain neutral, possibly indicating uncertainty or a need for further clarification.




The majority (46.88%) of students strongly agree that Teachers incorporate modern teaching aids such as PowerPoint presentations, web resources, multimedia, and e-content to enhance their teaching methods. An additional 25.52% agree, indicating general satisfaction. However, 5.34% express disagreement, and 0% strongly disagree, suggesting potential areas for improvement. A smaller percentage (22.26%) remain neutral, possibly indicating uncertainty or a need for further clarification.









However, 12.17% express disagreement, and 0% strongly disagree, suggesting potential areas for improvement. A smaller percentage (21.96%) remain neutral, possibly indicating uncertainty or a need for further clarification.



The majority (31.45%) of students strongly agree that The program curriculum was rich, work-oriented, and had interdisciplinary links. An additional 49.55% agree, indicating general satisfaction. However, 3.86% express disagreement, and 0% strongly disagree, suggesting potential areas for improvement. A smaller percentage (15.13%) remain neutral, possibly indicating uncertainty or a need for further clarification.



The majority (72.7%) of students strongly agree that The program provided a stimulating and challenging experience with contemporary and relevant course content. An additional 17.51% agree, indicating general satisfaction. However, 1.48% express disagreement, and 0% strongly disagree, suggesting potential areas for improvement. A smaller percentage (8.31%) remain neutral, possibly indicating uncertainty or a need for further clarification.

This feedback analysis underscores a nuanced understanding of the institution's strengths and areas for improvement. While students acknowledge opportunities for research and critical thinking, disparities exist in perceptions regarding the curriculum's alignment with industry standards, effectiveness of teaching methods, and promotion of cultural awareness. Addressing these discrepancies could enhance curriculum delivery and ensure better preparation of students for future challenges in both local and global contexts.
